It's hard to believe that another month has past. It seems like the days pass by so quickly. We have been blessed to be in the Wisconsin area for most of this month. We have been able to visit some churches and pastors that we have known for a number of years and have thoroughly enjoyed the fellowship we have shared. We also purchased a new vehicle (I mentioned that in the email last month) and have been enjoying the savings in fuel (30 mpg vs. 20 mpg). We have also been able to enjoy some fellowship with friends at our home church over the past month and that has been truly sweet.

One of the ministries that the Lord has been opening up at our home church is the opportunity to meet with a local philosophy club at a coffee house in downtown Madison. A couple of us started attending this meeting last fall and had some wonderful opportunities to share the Gospel. Since we have been in the area, I have had the opportunity to attend these meetings again. Two weeks ago I had the privilege of presenting the nights discussion topic, so I chose "Is there a consistent foundation for morality?" The topic gets posted in the newspaper and we had two men that came for the first time that night because of the topic. One of those men was a Russian atheist named Yuri who is working in the Madison area. Let's just say that it led to some interesting discussion. I praise the Lord for the opportunity to speak about the absolute authority of God's Word and to present the argument that without an absolute authority there can be no basis for morality. Please pray for the men that go down to this philosophy club meeting. God has opened a real door here to present the truth of the Gospel and God's Word.
